

SMARTPHONE/CELL PHONE POLICY REMINDER



As we begin the new school year, we want you to be aware of our smartphone/cell phone policy. This is from the Saint Ignatius College Prep Parent/Student Handbook: "During the school day, cell phones must be turned off and be out of sight from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Students may not use cell phones or have the devices in hand during school hours. Use of cell phones in locker rooms and bathrooms is off limits at all times. Failure to follow these directions will result in confiscation of the cell phone and two JUGs. A second violation of the cell phone policy may result in

confiscation of the phone and a Saturday JUG. Confiscated phones may be searched and will be returned to the owner following the service of one of the after-school JUGs. Continued violations will have additional consequences."

ATTENDANCE PROTOCOLS

When a student is absent, the parent(s)/guardian(s) should call the Deans' Office at 312-421-6435 or send an email to attendance@ignatius.org no later than 8:30 a.m. on the day of the student's absence. Voicemail messages or an email to attendance@ignatius.org from a verified parent email are both acceptable to report an absence. Absence notifications must include the student name, date, and the reason for the absence.



ANNUAL RETREAT INFORMATION

Senior Retreat: Mr. Nunez has placed all students on a senior retreat based on their ranked preferences. We have done our best to honor students' requests within the contexts of our program limits. We have given preference to students who have honored deadlines and shared requests in a timely manner. Mr. Nunez is still working on the requested switches, so please check with your student for their assigned retreat, and have them see Mr. Nunez with any questions.

Junior Retreat: Beginning this year, Student Formation and Ministry will offer two opportunities for juniors to go on Kairos during the second semester of their junior year. At the same time, the junior retreat has been a great experience that many juniors have shared as their favorite retreat. In light of this, juniors will have two retreat options to choose from : the Emmaus track, and the Kairos track. Students in the Emmaus track will make the traditional junior retreat during their junior year, and still have the chance to do Kairos or several other retreat options as a senior. This is a great fit for students who want to continue the growth they experienced from their sophomore retreat. For students who really enjoy retreats, who want to prioritize going more in-depth with a longer retreat, and who seek out the possibility of exercising future retreat leadership, the Kairos track can be a great fit. This can allow students the chance to apply to lead Kairos during their senior year. These students could also choose to make the junior retreat (now called Emmaus retreat) in their senior year, or one of the other senior retreat options. More information will be shared with juniors at an assembly during their first week. They will conclude the meeting with sharing preferences around their retreat selection.

Sophomore Retreat: Students will be assigned to their one-night, overnight retreat initially based on their theology class. Students will be emailed their retreat assignments in the first few weeks of school, after input from coaches and club moderators. Students should reach out ASAP if they have a conflict with their retreat assignment.

Freshman Retreat: All freshman students will attend the freshman retreat on campus on **Thursday, October 17 from 8:00 a.m. - noon.**
