

- You do not need to sign up for a Homeroom conference if your student has 1 period free.
- For in-person conferences, all teachers will be seated at tables organized alphabetically in Tully Hall. The Counselors, College Counselors, and Learning Specialists will have their conference tables in the McLaughlin Room. We suggest scheduling your student's Counselor, College Counselor, and/or Learning Specialist at the end of your reservations to allow for appropriate movement time to the McLaughlin Room.
- List your student's name when prompted in the system!

You should receive personalized schedules following the close of the sign-up window.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DEANS' OFFICE

ATTENDANCE

Starting on **Monday, September 30**, we will enable parents to view student attendance on Blackbaud. One important caveat to keep in mind: absence figures will be displayed according to period absences. For example, students typically have five classes a day, so if your student misses one day of school, Blackbaud will display five absences. In the rare, but not entirely out-of-the-question situation in which a student misses five days of school, 25 absences will be shown on Blackbaud. Figures as large as 25-30 will no doubt cause concern, but they are simply lesson periods missed.

DRESS CODE

Parents, just a quick reminder here on the rules for outerwear as we enter the fall season: Students may wear a collared shirt, sweater, turtleneck shirt, crew neck sweatshirt or Saint Ignatius quarter zip. In all cases, the top must reach the collarbone, the shirt must have sleeves (short or long) and the shirt must cover the midriff. Any of the shirts listed above may say "Ignatius" or "Saint Ignatius," otherwise shirts should contain no writing or numbers (although small logos are acceptable). Hoodies of any kind are prohibited indoors.

Students may wear a crew neck sweatshirt to school. The crew neck can be a plain or a Saint Ignatius sweatshirt, but should otherwise be free of any letters, numbers or large logos. This means that college sweatshirts, entertainment sweatshirts, or any other sweatshirt with a large image or message are prohibited during the school day. Hooded sweatshirts are only permitted on spirit wear days, and the only quarter zip sweatshirt that a student may wear is a Saint Ignatius quarter zip.
