ATTENDANCE COMMUNICATION

As we approach the mid-point of the semester, the Deans' Office has begun to send weekly attendance emails to students with **six** or more whole-day absences. These students, as well as their parents/guardians, will be notified that they have reached **six** absences to try to reduce any discretionary absences for the rest of the semester in efforts to avoid pass/fail status. As mentioned in the last post, the Deans' Office has enabled attendance visibility on Blackbaud for parents/guardians and students.

VACCINATION REMINDER FOR THE CLASS OF 2025

This is a reminder from the school nurse that all students in the 12th grade are required by the State of Illinois to show proof of recent Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccination (Mer ACWY). Please note that this vaccination is different from the Meningococcal B vaccination.

All 12th graders **MUST** provide proof of receiving two doses unless the first dose was administered after 16 years of age. In this case, one dose is sufficient. The meningococcal vaccine provides protection from a severe form of bacterial meningitis and other illnesses caused by this bacterium.

Students are subject to exclusion if the Meningococcal immunization deadline has not been met.

In addition to your health care provider, many local health departments and pharmacies offer the vaccine. **Forms are due no later than October 15, 2024.**

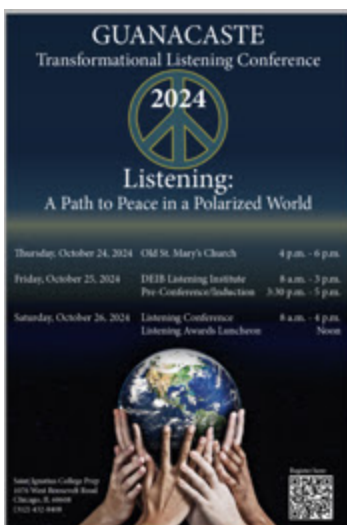

JUNIORS: SUMMER IMMERSION TRIPS AND FAITH/JUSTICE PROGRAMMING

All members of the Class of 2026 will attend a mandatory Activity Period assembly on **Monday, October 21** to learn more about faith and justice programs with Student Formation and Ministry.

At this assembly, we will first introduce our summer immersion trips which happen in June, July and August. As a reminder, participating in a trip counts toward the senior retreat requirement. We know summer schedules fill up quickly, so we want to be sure students have all the information to plan for these signature faith and justice experiences.

IGNATIAN VALUES DAY #2 AND ALL SAINTS DAY: **FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 1**

Pope Francis has announced [2025 as a Year of Jubilee](#), a special time of celebration in the Catholic Church. In preparation for this joyous occasion "Pilgrims of Hope," the Holy Father has designated 2024 to be a Year of Prayer. This is a time for us to share about the power of

prayer in our lives, and encourage others to commit to more regular ways to encounter the Lord in prayer.

During our Mass of All Saints, students and adults will remember the holy men and women who, while they have gone before us in this life, remain spiritually connected to us through the communion of saints. Following Mass, students and adults will hear different experiences of prayer from students and adults in our community.

FRESHMAN RETREAT: THURSDAY, OCTOBER 17

All freshman students will attend the annual Freshman Retreat, a half-day, on-campus retreat integrating service, prayer and fellowship through a variety of large and small-group activities on **October 17**.
