IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

The process begins tomorrow, Friday, January 24, for students in the Class of 2026. Other classes follow.

Registration information is posted in Blackbaud on the "Resources Board" under the "Registration" tile.

All registration assembly dates and course request due dates are listed below. The assemblies will be recorded, and the recordings will be posted on the "Resources Board" under the "Registration" tile in Blackbaud a couple of days after each presentation.

Students in the class of 2026 will be sent calendar invitations for a meeting date with their school counselor and college counselor to confirm all course requests. All other students will make reservations to meet with their school counselor using "Calendly." They may also request a meeting with their college counselor. All counselor "Calendly" links are posted in Blackbaud.

If a student would like to request a course not listed in the "Available Courses" list in Blackbaud, he/she may submit a request to add this course using a Google form. This form can be found on a student's Blackbaud page in the "Registration" tile.

Students should direct questions about registration to their school counselor.

Once students complete registration, they and their parents will receive an email listing all course requests. Once the registration period has ended, students will not be able to make changes to course requests.

COMPUTER SCIENCE KUDOS!

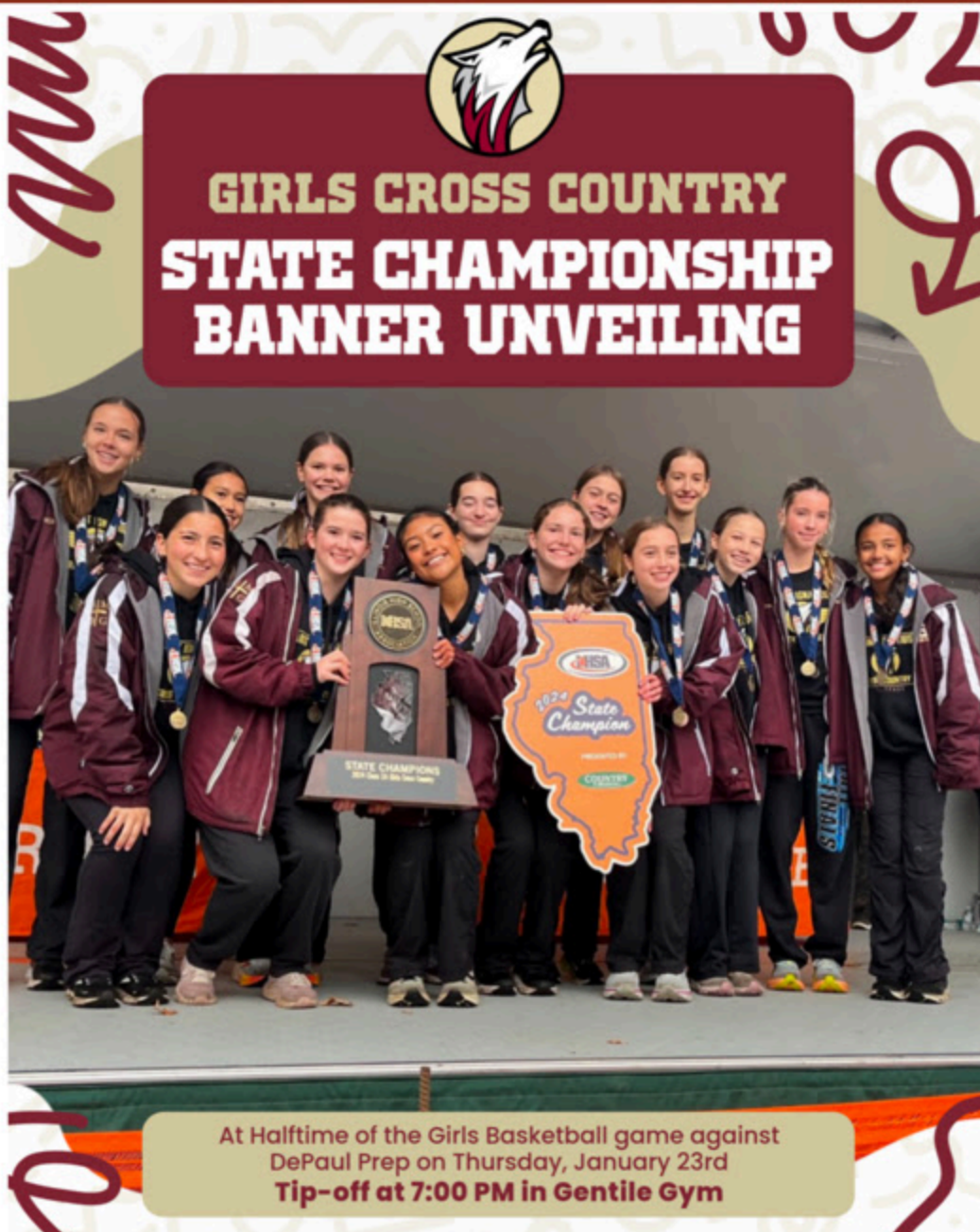
Congrats are in order for teacher and Computer Science Department Chair Matt Haffner! We received the following communication from the College Board:

- Mid-year transcripts (with 7th semester grades) have been sent to all your colleges.
- If you are deferred or waitlisted at a college, please follow all instructions in the decision letter to ensure continuing, if you should choose to do so, as a member of their application pool. If a "Letter of Continued Interest" is encouraged, feel free to run rough drafts by your college counselor.
- Seniors are encouraged to set up a 15-minute check-in with their college counselor using Calendly. These can be helpful conversations regarding college decision updates, scholarship opportunities, and discernment conversations.
- Seniors have three (3) college visit days to use as excused absences. Please see the Saint Ignatius College Prep [Parent-Student Handbook](#) for details.
- [FAFSA](#) (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) -- You can submit your 2025-2026 form today. Use the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC) to help complete your FAFSA right [HERE](#).

ACT Test Prep -- Registration deadline is **January 26**.

We have collaborated with Academic Approach to run in-person classes this spring. Classes run January through April and will be Monday and Wednesday from 3:15 p.m. - 5:15 p.m. Classes need a minimum of 10 students to run and have a maximum of 20 students. These classes will prepare students for future ACT or SAT exams including these hosted at Saint Ignatius: **ACT (April 5 and June 14) and SAT (March 12)**. Saint Ignatius is a registered location for those exams. The SAT is only for Saint Ignatius juniors and registration will be forthcoming from the Prefect's Office. The ACT sittings are national dates and you must register for those independently. Seats are limited.
