NEW OPPORTUNITY: CLASS OF 2027 BOSTON COLLEGE AMDG PROGRAM APPLICATION INVITATION

The Institute for Advanced Jesuit Studies at Boston College has invited Saint Ignatius College Prep to be part of a select group of Jesuit institutions to participate in the fully-funded **AMDG Program** launching this summer. **AMDG** is part of the Lilly Endowment's National Youth and Young Adult Initiative on Faith and Service. It aims to promote the renewal and expansion of

Catholic faith practices by promoting service that is accompanied through the lens of Jesuit spirituality. This piloted program will involve 25 Jesuit high schools and parishes.

Program expectations outline that students must have a year of high school remaining following program completion. As such, application is being made available to rising juniors. Members of the Saint Ignatius Class of 2027 are invited to apply to the 2025-2026 cohort of AMDG participants. 10 students will be selected. The program will cover the costs for travel, room and board, and materials. There is no program cost to the student. ***This unique opportunity calls for a serious, intentional commitment from the Summer of 2025 through the Summer of 2026, including the following expectations:***

- **AMDG** begins with the making of the Spiritual Exercises on the Boston College campus through participation in [Ever to Excel](#) occurring **July 13-18, 2025**.
- Participating Saint Ignatius students will commit to a long-term group service commitment while gathering periodically as a cohort to engage in spiritual conversation and the completion of **AMDG** formation modules during the 2025-2026 academic year.
- During the Fall of 2025, the student group will attend a retreat at a Jesuit retreat house in the United States.
- In the Summer of 2026, **AMDG** participants will travel to Spain for a capstone experience of a walking pilgrimage on the Camino Ignaciano. The Camino Ignaciano, or Ignatian Way, is a pilgrimage route in Spain that follows the path of St. Ignatius of Loyola in 1522. Trip details will be determined in consultation with the Institute for Advanced Jesuit Studies at Boston College. We expect the trip to span up to 10 days.

Interested participants should be confident in their Catholic faith, open to new experiences, and committed to completing the entirety of the program. Participants must also bring a spirit of openness and recognize that a number of details will continue to be determined as the program progresses.
