2025-2026 Spain Exchange Program - Application Now Open

We are excited to announce that applications are now open for the 2025–2026 Global Exchange Program between Saint Ignatius College Prep and Colegio San José in Villafranca de los Barros, Spain. This program offers students a unique opportunity to grow as global citizens by engaging in a linguistic and cultural exchange grounded in our shared Jesuit mission.

Students selected for the program will participate in a reciprocal exchange that includes both hosting and travel. In the fall of 2025, participants will welcome a visiting student from Colegio San José into their home. Hosting includes not only providing a place to stay, but also

supporting your student in experiencing daily life at Saint Ignatius and in Chicago through meaningful cultural engagement beyond the organized program activities. In the spring of 2026, participants will travel to Spain, staying either with the exchange partner's family or residing in the school's residence hall, depending on individual placements. This portion of the exchange offers the opportunity to experience daily life at Colegio San José and deepen one's understanding of Spanish culture through direct engagement with the host community. During both portions of the exchange, participating students will attend classes with their exchange partner and be fully immersed in the academic and social environments.

To be considered, **students must click [HERE](#) to complete the application form by May 30, 2025.** While you do not need to be enrolled in Spanish to apply, participants must have a basic command of the language and be able to communicate conversationally. Additional program details - including eligibility requirements, travel dates, hosting expectations and anticipated costs - are outlined in an informational document found within the application. The 90th Annual Memorial Day Parade and Mass that honors the deceased members of the Chicago Fire Department (CFD) and Chicago Firemen's American Legion Post #667 will be observed **Memorial Day**,

Monday, May 26, 2025. The ceremonies will begin at 9:30 a.m. with a parade of the uniformed members of the Chicago Fire Department led by The Pipes and Drums of the CFD. The Mass follows at 10:00 a.m.

Over the last three years, I've enjoyed getting to know so many of you -- from students, to teachers, to parents. When I started here, I truly felt like a freshman. I had just finished a 30-year career in television news, and while many of the communications skills I brought over from journalism prepared me for the new role at Saint Ignatius College Prep, the job never failed to challenge me to be Open to Growth. What a learning experience! Here are some of the notable moments:

CRISIS COMMS

In the aftermath of a frightening wreck involving a school bus carrying our JV hockey team, instead of covering the crisis, I had to communicate through it -- and I didn't do it alone. Many

thanks to our Hockey coaches and families for being so graceful and helpful in the toughest of circumstances.

WEBSITE REVAMP

The website we have today is much improved from the website this Communications Office inherited. I was able to tell our story thanks to input from all sectors on campus. This included picture permission from students, faculty and staff; video moments (sometimes reluctant, but always appreciated) from our Wolfpack leaders; and last, but certainly not least, the build collaboration with IT whiz Gene Shlikhutka. I was so lucky to have his partnership in the quest to bring the revamped Ignatius.org to life!

RE-BRANDING

Change is never easy. During my tenure, we asked you to embrace "Saint Ignatius College Prep," instead of "St." or "SICP." Thank you for your input and for moving forward with the evolution that impacted everything from social media platforms, to email signatures, to spirit wear. Consistency in brand is key in a world of hyper-messaging. You helped us to be more clear!

SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORM GROWTH

In three years we nearly tripled our following on Instagram (FUN FACT: In the last 30 days we've had more than 700K views on the Gram). We also significantly grew our presence on LinkedIn and Facebook. Thanks to our students, parents, faculty and staff for giving us something to smile about and always providing great content to share with the world!

INTER-DEPARTMENT COLLABORATION

We've accomplished our best video and printed material work in collaboration with other departments. I am especially grateful to have worked closely on content with Admissions and Development. High points: the Class of 2028 and 2029 welcome videos, the admissions guide, storytelling around Sodality Hall, testimonials from alumni and putting faces and voices to our Mission statement.

EXTERNAL COMMUNICATIONS

As communications director, one of my primary responsibilities was to be Cheerleader-In-Chief. Over three years, I've loved sharing our big stories with local and national media -- from Christopher Christmas, to the Girls Cross Country all-school clap-in, to honoring Bob Newhart '47. Special thanks to students and staff who chose to participate in multiple big projects:

Mrs. MaryEllen Schneider and her talented musicians and vocalists said "yes" to various televised projects with the Archdiocese of Chicago.

David Letterman's My Next Guest Needs No Introduction featured students from the Class of 2024. The production won a National Emmy -- certainly something those alums can be proud of. We

also got a tall-order compliment from John Mulaney '00 that put an exclamation point on the remarkable teaching here. Mr. Mulaney said he received a better education at Saint Ignatius than he did at Georgetown. Wow!

Countdown Chicago 2025 on ABC 7 reached about one million viewers on New Year's Eve. We couldn't have accomplished the large-scale project without the cooperation and collaboration of more than 100 students (who learned choreography and danced their hearts out); the incredible work of the always-phenomenal Operations staff; teacher Chris Marks' technical enthusiasm that resulted in an awesome audio cart; and the vision of President John Chandler. He saw the value in allocating considerable time and resources to both projects. They allowed us to share the Wolfpack with so many people.

HUGE gratitude for Ryan Bergin, Henry Ceffalio and Tina Bobor, the small-but-mighty Communications team. Your work is valuable and valued -- Keep it up! Many thanks to the Saint Ignatius College Prep Leadership Team and so many of the department directors who had a hand in communications, a team sport.

Finally (I know this is long, but it's important), popping into classrooms, being a "fly on the wall" for our great events and having the opportunity to interact with our wonderful students made my time here memorable and fun. Stand-out moments: Speaking at last year's SIMUN conference and guest-lecturing in Ms. Ayanna King's and Mr. Will Jones' class for their unit on *The Things They Carried*. I got to share a personal story about my dad's letters to my mom during the Vietnam War.

That brings us to NOW. For years, I've dreamed of writing a book about those letters, so later this summer I'll be leaving this job to pursue the passion project of a lifetime. Scared? Yes. Energized? YES! Grateful? YES! Thank you for the opportunity to pivot, to learn about what it means to be Jesuit and to share the beautiful story that is Saint Ignatius College Prep. It's been an honor.

SIMUN SUMMER CAMP SESSIONS FOR 5TH - 9TH GRADERS: DIPLOMACY IN ACTION!

Session 1: **June 9, 10, 11, and 12 from 12:30 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.**

Session 2: **June 16, 17, 18, and 20 from 12:30 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.**

Our SIMUN Model United Nations camp sessions involve activities that are fun, engaging and interactive. They help students develop and improve their communication, negotiation, collaboration, problem-solving and leadership skills. Students participate in role-playing simulations that focus on international diplomacy as exercised by diplomats at the United Nations.
