CAMPUS SAFETY

UPDATED SAFETY MEASURES

At Saint Ignatius, the safety of our students, faculty and staff remains our highest priority. Our Operations Staff is actively enhancing both our facilities and security protocols to uphold this commitment. Below are some of the latest improvements:

- **IHM Building: While badge access is already required, an Operations Staff member will now be stationed at the entrance during school hours to monitor all entry and exit.**
- **1055 Parking Lot: A security arm has been installed to better control access, with badge access now mandatory for entry.**

We remind all community members to never prop open exterior doors or allow unauthorized entry by others. All visitors including our volunteers must enter through the main doors on Roosevelt Road and check in at the security/reception desk.

Senior Family College Application Workshop (Virtual)

Common Application

On August 1, the 2025-2026 Common Application went "live." Each senior should open an account and begin to complete the application. Students can finish much of it prior to the start of the school year. We suggest focusing on the Activities page and having a completed rough draft of the Common Application personal essay. ACT Prep Class - Senior Class Option

This 12-hour course is designed for 12th graders who plan to retake the ACT in October. The class will review the most common question types and key testing strategies. DEANS' OFFICE

DRESS CODE

We will be enforcing the Saint Ignatius College Prep Dress Code as students arrive in the morning and throughout the day. Here are some important reminders:

- **Collared shirts are required at all times.** Any student wearing a quarter-zip garment, an Ignatius crew neck sweatshirt or a sweater must have a collared shirt underneath.
- **Acceptable skirts will be no more than three inches above the knee.** We will not permit athletic skirts and skirts with material splits.
- **Hoodies are not permitted inside the building.**
- **Sweaters or sweatshirts with large logos of any kind are not permitted.**

LATE ARRIVAL POLICY

We only excuse late arrivals to school with a note from the doctor. Students arriving late should always report to the Deans' Office upon arrival.

- Arrivals after 8:30 a.m. without a note will receive a JUG.
- Arrivals after 11:30 a.m. without a note will receive a double JUG.

A student must arrive by 11:30 a.m. in order to participate in or attend co-curricular or athletic events after school. This applies to students who arrive late to school even if they are ill. A student who leaves school ill may not return to participate in or attend co-curricular activities.


