Dual Credit Program

Dual Credit Program with Loyola University

We are proud to partner with Loyola University Chicago to give Saint Ignatius students a head start on their college journey through our Dual Credit Program.

This unique opportunity allows students to earn college credit and high school credit at the same time. Courses are taught here at Saint Ignatius, but the grades students earn are recorded as official Loyola University grades — building their college transcript before they even graduate high school.

Each course is offered at \$65 per credit hour. The approved courses for 2025-26 are:

- AP English Literature
- AP Spanish Language
- AP Spanish Literature
- AP French Language
- AP Chinese AP Latin

Retreats

All students are expected to attend a retreat each year as it is a graduation requirement. Formation and Ministry works with coaches, moderators and fine arts leaders to give input into placing students on retreat during less busy times.

Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors will have access to view their retreat assignments by August 29th after which they will have until September 5th to request any changes. Only important family events and extenuating circumstances will be considered for change requests. A link to a view-only spreadsheet will be shared with all Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors on August 29th. Please check with your son or daughter about their retreat assignment.

Freshman Service Commitment

We are excited to begin the journey of service with both freshmen and sophomores. Each freshman will complete 10 service hours this year. 5 hours must be completed by Dec 2, 2025 and the other 5 hours must be completed by April 28, 2026. Here are the [Freshmen service requirements](#). Before doing any service, we ask all freshmen to come to FAM suite 140 to discuss their service plan and be approved for that service. No emails, please! We want to GET TO KNOW OUR STUDENTS and for them to get to know us! All freshmen service hours must be logged into Mobile Serve - an App that Saint Ignatius uses to approve service hours. We will give more instructions on how to do this soon in the Freshman Advisory period. After logging in the hours to the Mobile Serve App, students must ask their site supervisor to verify their hours before leaving the service site. The FAM staff approves those hours only when they are verified in Mobile Serve.

Freshman Retreat

All freshmen get the chance to attend a half-day on Campus retreat on October 16. The theme of this retreat is "Corpus" - Body (of Christ). The subthemes are Faith, Service, and Community. The Arrupe mentors will be present to guide the Freshmen.

Sophomore Service Commitment

The focus of sophomore year is on BEING OPEN to Growth: Specifically, we are challenging the Sophomores this year to focus their service on THE larger Chicago COMMUNITY. This means expanding beyond Saint Ignatius! Particularly, we ask that Sophomores prioritize an opportunity that allows them to work directly with a vulnerable or marginalized group, in a face-to face setting. Ideally, they would complete all their hours with the same organization. This allows the Sophomores to

build connections with people over time: they get to know students, and students get to know them. This can allow a feeling of solidarity, of deeper connection that can have huge impacts on how students see the world. These connections allow them to become a person/people WITH others.

All sophomores are invited to complete 15 service hours - 10 hours are due by December 4 and 5 are due by March 17, 2026. Here are the [Sophomore service requirements](#).
