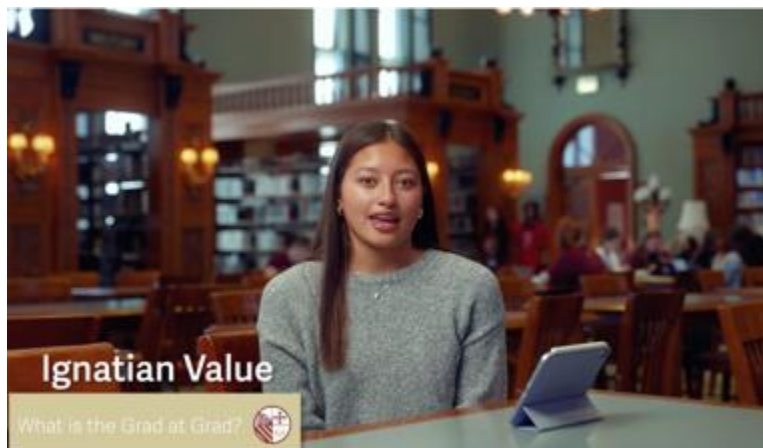

### ***Advanced Placement (AP) Exams***

AP Exams take place during the first two full weeks of May and are required for students in AP courses. Students who are taking AP classes have already registered for their exam in the AP Classroom portal using their teachers' Join Codes. The fees for these exams will be billed through the Finance Office in the October tuition bill.

There are a couple of optional Exam Only AP tests available; they are as follows:

- **AP English:** All Juniors are encouraged to take the AP English Language exam, particularly if they plan to take AP English Literature as seniors. This exam is also open to seniors. Historically, our students score well enough to earn college credit. Use this [link](#) and join code to register.
  - AP English Language and Composition (Join Code: GD7WWM)
- **AP World History:** Freshmen have the option to take the AP World History exam. Students are encouraged to speak to their World History teacher to see if they would be a strong candidate for this exam. Use this [link](#) and join code to register:
  - AP World History (Join Code: G39Z74)

The deadline for AP registration is Thursday, September 11. You will be billed \$100 for each exam through your Ignatius Blackbaud Tuition Management account.
