COLLEGE COUNSELING

Naviance & Common Application: Some reminders from College Counseling

- If you haven't already, please "match" your Common Application to Naviance.

- Next, take a moment to list all of the colleges you're applying to in Naviance under **“Colleges I’m Applying To”** - including the correct application deadlines. This step makes it possible for your College Counselor to send your transcripts and recommendations on time. If you’re using an institutional application instead of the Common App, let us know by noting that in Naviance.
- For any colleges with an **October 15 deadline**, please have them entered into Naviance by **October 1**. This extra lead time helps us ensure that all of your recommendations and paperwork are submitted smoothly.
- If you plan to send ACT or SAT scores, remember that these must be sent **directly through the ACT or College Board** websites as soon as possible. *College Counseling does not send test scores and they are not included on your transcript.*

We’re here to help support you every step of the way - thank you for keeping these details in mind so we can meet your deadlines together!

All transcripts have been uploaded into Naviance. Please check yours in Blackbaud for accuracy. Any changes that need to be made can be done through Mr. Bellie, Registrar.

ACT Prep Course Opportunity

Sunday, October 19 - Noon to 5 p.m.


Volunteering Opportunities
