

A selective admissions process at Saint Ignatius College Prep fills classrooms with students who are committed to academic excellence. # Faith and Service



As a school with a particular Jesuit charism, students are introduced to Ignatian spirituality and a larger network of Jesuit schools that promote a “faith that does justice.”

At Saint Ignatius, we celebrate the active presence of God in our lives through prayer, retreats, liturgy, sacraments, service, and justice work.

Ignatian Values Days, special mission days devoted to our liturgical life and reflection on our “Grad at Grad” values, are specific examples of how we celebrate our mission each year.

Saint Ignatius students do not just learn about faith, in imitation of Jesus, **they live it.**



## IN THE JESUIT TRADITION, IGNATIANS ARE CHALLENGED TO BECOME “MEN AND WOMEN FOR AND WITH OTHERS” IN IMITATION OF JESUS.

Saint Ignatius College Prep provides many ways for our students to live their faith by following the tenets of the Roman Catholic Church and Catholic Social Teaching, including prioritizing the needs of the poor and vulnerable. Students commit to thirty hours of service in their first two years working among people who experience marginalization. Juniors and seniors continue their service work through organizations like the Ignatian Volunteer Corps. They also embark on week-long summer immersion trips.

The student body is invited to full participation in:

- School-wide and class year family Masses
- Daily prayer of the Examen (daily prayerful reflection and practice of Ignatian Spirituality)
- Advent and Lenten Reconciliation Services
- Class retreats that deepen in length and impact every year
- Retreat leadership opportunities

Saint Ignatius offers many athletic, artistic, cultural, service-oriented, and social programs for our students. These opportunities allow students to realize the Jesuit ideal of "cura personalis" or the "care of the whole person."




## ADMISSIONS POLICY, CRITERIA, AND PROCESS

Saint Ignatius College Prep accepts applicants on the basis of entrance exam scores, previous academic performance, and standardized testing, the promise of future development, consideration of Catholic heritage/school, the family's history (if any) with the school, and adherence to the policies of the school. Saint Ignatius College Prep admits students of any gender, race, or ethnic origin. All the rights, privileges, programs, and activities are available to them. We do not discriminate on the basis of gender, race, or ethnic origin in the administration of our educational policies or policies related to admissions, tuition assistance, athletics, and other school-administered programs.

An applicant for admission to the freshman class must be in the 8th grade. To be considered for admission to Saint Ignatius, students must take the High School Placement Test (HSPT) Entrance Exam at Saint Ignatius and complete an application for admission.

Saint Ignatius College Prep has a holistic admissions review process. Application components are reviewed collectively and comprehensively. Along with the HSPT Entrance Exam scores, our application for admission includes: final 7th grade and first term 8th grade report cards, a record of standardized testing from 7th and/or 8th grade, student and parent applicant statements, a student's birth certificate, and recommendations.

Each year, the school awards more than \$6 million in assistance to help families cover the cost of tuition, books, technology, school-sponsored activities, summer programs, and meals. The average award exceeds \$16,000, with grants ranging from \$2,250 to \$22,100. For the Class of 2029, 85% of families who applied for tuition assistance received a financial aid award.

To execute the Financial Aid Program in a fair and consistent way, Saint Ignatius College Prep partners with FACTS to process financial aid applications. Based on the information submitted online by families (income, assets, expenses, and liabilities), FACTS processes applications and estimates the amount your family can contribute to education expenses.

We understand that family expenses vary depending on the unique circumstances of each family. Therefore, in order to be fair to all applicants, we respectfully request full disclosure of income and ask that families carefully consider their expenses.

A copy of a family's federal tax return is required. For separated or divorced families, each parent or guardian must submit an application if they would like to be considered for financial aid.

## FINANCIAL AID PROCESS

The financial aid application for incoming freshman families opens on October 1, 2025, and all applications are due by January 6, 2026.

The application is completed through FACTS Grant & Aid. Completion of a financial aid application does not impact the admissions decision.

Incoming freshman families who complete their financial aid application, including all required tax documents, by January 6, 2026, will be notified of their award via email by January 30, 2026. A completed application must include a copy of the 2024 federal 1040 tax return with all schedules and W-2 forms. The enrollment contract for students admitted to the Class of 2030 is due February 13, 2026.

Financial Aid applications for late applicants and incoming transfer applicants are handled on a case-by-case basis. Returning students and families must re-apply for tuition assistance each year.

### CAMPUS TOURS


**Can't wait to join the Pack?** Campus tours are available for small groups of 6th and 7th grade students and their families on select days in the fall and spring.

## HOW TO GET TO SAINT IGNATIUS COLLEGE PREP

Our 27-acre historic campus is centrally located on the near west side of Chicago. Saint Ignatius, situated directly west of UIC's campus, is surrounded by the following neighborhoods: South Loop, Dearborn Park, Near South Side, Pilsen, Illinois Medical District, and Greektown. Our location is one of our greatest blessings as it allows us to draw students from all over the city and state. A big part of who we are – and who our students are – stems from where we are. Approximately 1500 young women and men travel to Saint Ignatius every day from more than 130 zip codes representing neighborhoods throughout the Chicagoland area, suburbs, and northwest Indiana. In our freshman class we often have 70-80 students who are the only student coming from their elementary school.

Saint Ignatius College Prep is easily accessible via CTA, Metra, or driving. Saint Ignatius is located less than one mile from all major Chicago Interstates.
