Girls Swimming & Diving routed the competition at the season opener, Ike Invitational, in New Berlin, WI. Senior Aisling Crowley, Freshmen Caitlin Seder, and sophomore Alexis Nelson swept the 11 dive competition. Sophomore Delaney Brown won the 6 dive competition. The 200 Medley Relay team of Senior Captain Jilly MacNamara, freshmen Mariposa Arroyo, sophomore Colleen Tracy, and sophomore Francesca Sanchez won the event by almost 6 seconds. MacNamara would join sophomore Liepa Niaura to take second and third place in the 200 free, and later first and second in the 100 back. Tracy and freshman Livia Cremer swept the 200 IM. Tracy later scored third in the 100 freestyle. Senior Captain Maya Arroyo won the 50 free and 100 fly and was joined by Niaura, Sanchez, and Tracy to win the 200 free relay. Freshman Mariposa Arroyo was a double event winner in the 500 free and 100 breaststroke. In the final event of the invitational, the 400 freestyle relay, the Wolfpack swept 1-2 with the relay team of Niaura, Arroyo, Cremer, and MacNamara winning the event. Saint Ignatius won with a commanding 647 points. The next competitor finished with 264 points.

Girls Volleyball

Girls Volleyball moved to 7-2 overall after a 3rd Place finish at the tough New Trier Invite.

Facing all 4A schools, the Wolfpack dominated on day one defeating Loyola (25-18, 25-23), Glenbrook North (25-19, 25-23) and Hersey (23-25, 25-18, 15-12). On day two, the Pack came ready to play, stealing a game from New Trier 25-22, but the Trevians showed how tough they are at home winning the next two games 25-14, 15-8. The last match of the invite was against Wisconsin state power Hamilton. The Pack fought tough but lost 25-14, 25-22. Skylar Greene (34 kills, 5 blocks), Audrey Schabes (110 assists, 3 aces), Sydney DeProfio (16 kills, 3 aces, 7 blocks), Maggie Rankin (20 kills, 6 blocks), Marin Thaxton (28 kills, 3 aces) and Mariella Ciaravino (13 kills, 2 aces, 2 Blocks) led the Wolfpack.

After a long career in business, Ed Peisner founded the Organization for Social Media Safety in 2017 after his teenage son Jordan was viciously assaulted in West Hills, California. The attack was filmed and uploaded to social media by an associate of the attacker. Jordan was left with serious and life-long injuries from the assault. Ed decided to dedicate himself to the goal of ensuring that no other family had to endure such a terrible ordeal.
