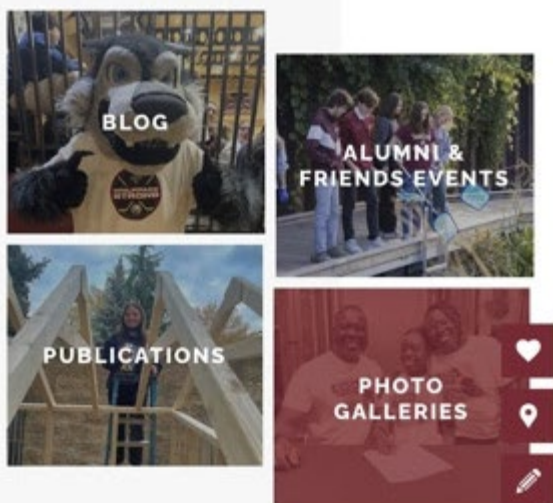

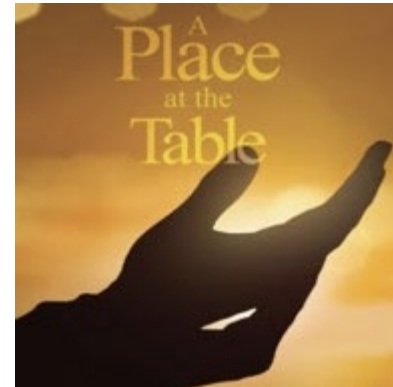
Third Annual Listening Conference, October 5-7, 2023

JUNIOR RETREAT

If a student anticipates a conflict with their date, they will need to find another student to swap with and inform Mrs. Swann-Covington about the request. In the event of a family emergency, please let the chaplain know as soon as possible. The retreat is a requirement for graduation, but more importantly, it is a very important element in the formation for our juniors. Being fully present and participating leads to a successful experience. We look forward to having your child on the retreat.

SOPHOMORE RETREAT SCHEDULING

Retreat assignments have been sent to all sophomore and junior students. Parents, please verify that your son/daughter has reviewed and confirmed their assigned placement. If there are any scheduling concerns, students should contact their class chaplain as soon as possible.

SOPHOMORE SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

Parents, please check in with your sophomore students about their plans for service this year and encourage them to stop by Formation and Ministry to have their plans approved. 10 total service hours will be due by Friday, December 8, and we want to make sure everyone is on track to meet this deadline. This helps to make sure that expectations are clear before students begin service at their chosen sites.

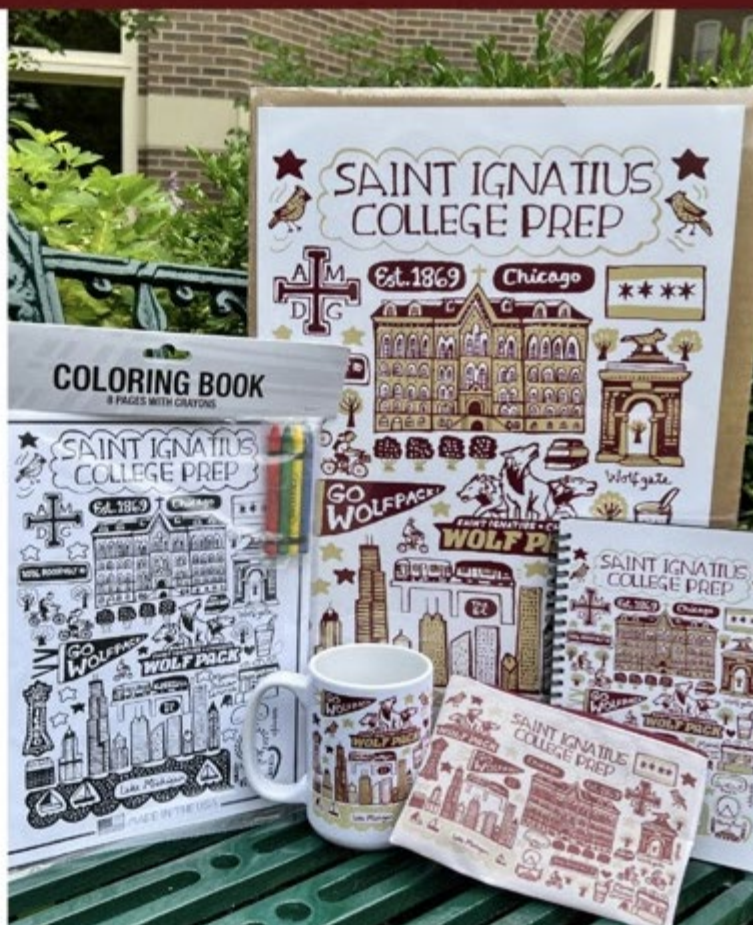
