CAMPUS SAFETY

The well-being of our students, faculty and staff is our number one priority. It's why we want to keep the conversation about campus safety and security top-of-mind by sharing updates with you right here in the *Wolfpack Post*.

Safety Measure Improvement: A permanent, high resolution security camera from UIC is up and running again, providing visual coverage of our athletic fields and the Barbara Jean

Wright rental properties.

Bolstered Security Presence: At the beginning and end of every day, we will be staffing a security vehicle which we'll place at our student parking lot. The vehicle will be clearly marked with lights, and very soon, signage as well. This detail began today.

ACADEMICS

KUDOS!

Saint Ignatius College Prep has earned a place on the College Board's AP School Honor Roll! The designation for the 2022-2023 academic year recognizes schools that "have done outstanding work to welcome more students into AP courses and support them on the path to college success." The Wolfpack is also celebrating an AP Access Award which honors schools that encourage more financially challenged and underrepresented students to take AP



classes. One final congratulatory note: The AP School Honor Roll named Saint Ignatius a Platinum school. That means -- among other things -- that we've enabled 80 percent of the Class of 2024 to experience at least one AP class before graduation.

SEMESTER EXAMS

Semester exams will be given in a different format this year. All students will take their exams in their regularly scheduled classroom with their teacher. The exam periods are 100 minutes in length. All students will have 90 minutes to complete an exam created to be completed in 60 minutes. The exam schedule is:

Tuesday, December 12 - A, B, I

Wednesday, December 13 - C, D

Thursday, December 14 - E, F

Friday, December 15 - G, H

There are no classes meeting on these days. The days are reserved for the administration of semester exams.

All students will receive a personalized exam schedule the week of November 27.

As in the past, some classes might not be giving a semester exam during the scheduled exam days. If this is the case, the teacher will announce this to the class and students need not attend this scheduled exam time.

If a student has three exams scheduled for Tuesday, December 12 and he/she would like to reschedule his/her I period exam, the student will be asked to complete a Google form request to reschedule the I period exam for another exam day. All requests will be reviewed

and an approval email will be sent with the rescheduled exam details.

For any questions regarding exams, please contact your student's school counselor.

2023-2024 PRINCETON RACE CHALLENGE

The 2023-2024 Princeton Race Challenge Application Portal opens next month on November 13. The program is sponsored by Princeton University and is principally undertaken by its alumni. The Princeton Challenge honors high school students who have demonstrated notable work in race relations. The mission of the Princeton Prize is this: "To identify and recognize high-school-age students who significantly engage and challenge their schools or communities to advance racial equity in order to promote respect and understanding among all people." Each of the Princeton Prize in Race Relations recipients receives an award of \$1,000 and is invited to participate in a Symposium on Race. 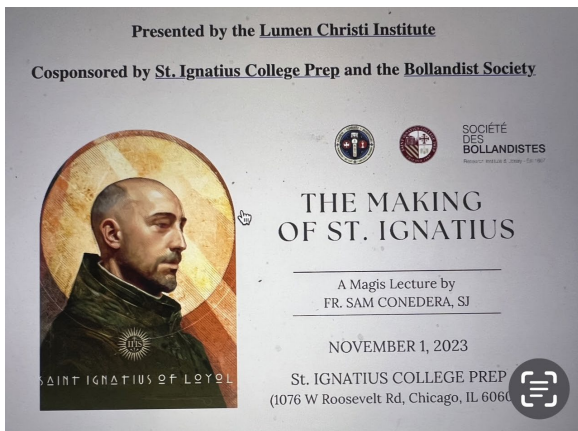

Illinois legislators have a choice: They can invest in children by actively sustaining the Invest in Kids Act Tax Credit Scholarship Program, or they can allow the program to sunset by doing

nothing. If that happens, scholarships that give thousands of students from income-challenged families across Illinois the ability to attend the best school for them - will disappear. That means they'd be at risk of losing their pathway to college. Nearly 100 students from Saint Ignatius College Prep receive scholarship funds because of the tax credit program.
