MATH DEPARTMENT NEWS

Summer Math Fun

The math department will continue to run advancement courses over the summer. All math advancement courses will take place on campus from **June 3 - June 28**. We offer Precal Survey and Algebra 2/Trig Survey.

Algebra 2/Trig Survey covers an entire year of Algebra 2. Students will be expected to complete asynchronous online modules prior to the in person course. During the month of June, students will attend class in person for 3 hours a day and need to complete additional assignments outside of class. Students need to have an A in Geometry or Geometry Honors and teacher recommendation to take this class. Students are encouraged to speak with their current math teacher or counselor as they plan their classes for next year. For those students who qualify, there will be an interest form sent out in February including more details of the course and registration information. Specific details of this course can be found in the 2024 - 2025 Curriculum Guide on Blackbaud.

Any student who successfully completed Algebra 2/Trig Part 1 last summer (2023) will continue their path with Algebra 2/Trig Part 2 this summer. This class will also run from June 3 - June 28. All students who took part 1, and are eligible to continue, will receive information on how to sign up in March.
