The first and most recent was SIMUN's performance at the North American Model United Nations Conference (NAIMUN) in Washington, D.C. The students certainly brought their collective best to what you might call the team's version of "nationals." Saint Ignatius College Prep joined 3,300 delegates from 175 schools around the world. SIMUN Program Director Diane Haleas says, "Our team persevered through four days of intense, challenging diplomacy."

During their free time, members of the team met to bounce ideas off one another or talk through frustrations. They also came together every night at Mass, which typically would run until 1:00 a.m. Haleas says it was the spiritual and personal connection piece that strengthened their team.

Their hard work and their attention to "team" paid off: SIMUN won **OUTSTANDING LARGE DELEGATION!** Haleas explains, "To win a delegation award, a team must win numerous awards in many committees. It is a formidable task that requires months of preparation and practice. It's why our SIMUN team adopted TEAMWORK as our theme for this conference."

One of the quotes they focused on for inspiration: "**THE STRENGTH OF THE WOLF IS IN THE PACK.**" You can hear (right [HERE](#)) the students' chant in victory - a victory that clearly didn't ride on just one person. At NAIMUN the whole group mattered. In life collaboration matters. What great preparation. Congrats to our SIMUN team.

SAT EXAM

The School Day SAT with essay exam for Juniors has been moved to **Tuesday, April 9, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.** due to scheduling conflicts. Juniors who registered in the fall to test will come to school with their fully charged iPads and keyboard to take the exam in either the 3rd floor gym or the Brunswick Room. Students will receive a personal email with their specific location and details regarding the Digital Readiness Check which must be completed before the exam day. The Bluebook app that was used to take the PSAT in the fall will be utilized for the digital SAT and must be installed on the student iPad.


A SPECIAL VISIT

Fr. Brian Taber, S.J. and the Church of the Holy Family's Tina Bobor and Wendy McCarthy have been working together to make a special visit possible.

Fr. Eric Immel, S.J. has been touring Canada and the United States with the skull relic of Saint Jean de Brébeuf. As part of his tour - which is stopping here on Friday, March 1 - he educates people about the life and death of the Jesuit missionary (pictured in the image) who was martyred in 1649 while doing the work of the Faith.

Literature about the tour says the skull relic has become "a focal point of veneration...attracting pilgrims and believers seeking spiritual solace and connection to the martyred missionary's legacy."

Saint Ignatius College Prep students will be able to connect with that legacy when their theology sections visit with Fr. Immel at the Church. By the end of the day, some 1,000 members of the Wolfpack will have seen and learned about the relic of the Saint who, in the words of Fr. Taber, "really lived and did good for the sake of the Gospel."



Students who do not have a theology class on March 1, and who would like to learn about the relic, can do so immediately after school. Fr. Immel will be at the Church.

The greater community also will have an opportunity to see the reliquary and the relic of St. Jean de Brébeuf. Fr. Immel will be part of a **Mass at 6:00 p.m. at the Church of the Holy Family on March 1**. A presentation will follow at 7:00 p.m., and veneration of the relic will be from 8:00 to 9:00 p.m. There's also a gathering at Saint Ignatius College Prep starting at 8:00 p.m. Please use the "QR" code here to get to the registration information.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DEANS' OFFICE

STUDENTS WHO ARRIVE AT SCHOOL AFTER 8:30 WILL GET A JUG.

- We do not allow students to arrive late to school because they were sleeping in, studying for a test, feeling ill, etc.

- If students are late to school due to an appointment, they must arrive with a note from the appointment to excuse them from JUG.
- If students are feeling ill in the morning, we encourage you to keep them home so they feel better and can return to school the next day.
- Students must attend half of their classes in order to participate in any activities after school.

NO STUDENT IS ALLOWED OFF CAMPUS AT ANY TIME DURING NORMAL SCHOOL HOURS WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE DEANS' OFFICE.

- Students may leave the building at the start of the last period, if they have the last period free.
- If a student has consecutive free periods at the end of the day, or if the student needs to leave early for any reason, the student must present an Early Dismissal Form to the Deans' Office before school. It should be signed by one parent or guardian, and it should indicate that the student has permission to leave after his/her last class of the day.
- Students must sign out in the Deans' Office before exiting the building.
- Leaving campus earlier than permitted will result in a minimum of a Saturday detention.
- NOTE: Once students are dropped off for the school day, they should remain on campus until they are permitted to leave.
