ILLINOIS YOUTH SURVEY ADMINISTRATION

On Monday, March 25, Saint Ignatius will administer the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS) to the student body. The Illinois Youth Survey is coordinated by the Center for Prevention Research and Development at the University of Illinois. As articulated by the [IYS website](#), "the purpose of the survey is to better understand youth attitudes and behaviors that can impact student problems and academic success. It will ask students about topics including nutrition, physical activity, bullying, tobacco, alcohol and other drug use."

This survey is confidential and is completely voluntary.


DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION

IGNATIAN VALUES DAY: THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL - A DECADE WITH POPE FRANCIS

Over the past ten years, Pope Francis has challenged the Catholic Church to grow in love of God and one another, especially those people on the margins. He writes, "I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting, and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a Church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security." Through humble action and extensive discernment, Pope Francis has inspired and challenged many throughout the world. Our Ignatian Values Day, entitled "The Joy of the Gospel - A Decade with Pope Francis," will acknowledge this important milestone. Similar to last year's IVD on Caring for our Common Home, this IVD will be offered as a unique "IVD Summit Model." It will feature more than 30 dynamic, interdisciplinary, and interactive breakout sessions led by fellow students, adults, and external presenters.

FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES: SERVICE REQUIREMENT UPDATES

Please check in with your students about their progress towards the freshmen and sophomore service requirements. End-of-year deadlines for service are now less than two months away - April 24 for freshmen, and April 26 for sophomores. Sophomores will also have a final service reflection due May 1. Students who did not complete half of the yearly total by the fall semester deadline have received an incomplete mark for service on their report card. That incomplete will remain until the hours are completed. If they have any questions about the incomplete, they should see Mr. Doyle as soon as possible. **Beginning April 1, students will no longer have incompletes removed for Fall semester; instead, Fall incompletes will be removed along with completion of the year's full service requirement.**
