An Extra-Special Welcome Home

We are so fortunate world travel is a possibility for students here at Saint Ignatius College Prep. We are also blessed with bright, capable minds who guide those groups. On April 4, we learned why that leadership is so important. Twenty of our students were in Taiwan with Fr. Aaron Bohr, S.J., and Dr. Miriam Leung, when a powerful earthquake struck. The teachers, along with tour personnel, made sure our young people were safe, and helped them through the remainder of the trip.

Dr. Leung summed it up best:

"The eight-day Easter trip to Taiwan returned to Chicago on the evening of April 6 as planned. What was not anticipated was the traumatic event added on Day 5. We started the day with a 7.4 magnitude earthquake in Hualien, Taiwan, the most severe one in 25 years. Fortunately, we were blessed with many helpers, and we were all well-taken care of. Our strong little community managed to regroup and return to our travel bus that day, taking an alternative route, and continued our enriching journey for the remainder of the trip. We are thankful for the care and messages received from around the world, especially for the thoughts and prayers from you. Our students have shown resilience and strength, and we have all learned the importance of trust."

Thank you to everyone who sent kind thoughts to our travelers. Their smiles upon their return spoke volumes.

SCHOOL COUNSELING

SPECIAL PRESENTATION!

School Counseling and the Parent Organization are collaborating to host an in-person presentation on **April 23 at 6:30 p.m. in the McLaughlin Theater**. It's called "**Essentials to Effective Parenting: The One Hour Road Map to Raising Kids Who Thrive.**"

If we have learned anything from living through a global pandemic, it's that today's kids need to be able to adjust and recalibrate. They also need guidance on how to manage everyday challenges with confidence and composure. But how do we ensure that our kids are prepared to roll with the inevitable punches of daily life, and function well in both good times and hard times? And how can we be sure that as parents we are equipping them to succeed rather than accidentally handicapping them?

Dr. Heather Tedesco will give the science and the strategies for how to develop the skills kids need to become more adaptable, resilient humans. The goal is to get them to the point where they're capable of self-motivation, managing anxiety and tolerating uncertainty, so they are best prepared to thrive for the long-term.

Dr. Tedesco is a licensed Applied Psychologist with a Ph.D. in Social Psychology, and she is a well-known parenting expert in the Washington D.C. area. She has a private practice in McLean, Virginia, where she works exclusively with parents to help them raise kids who can thrive while making parenting less stressful, more effective and more enjoyable. Her specialty is simplifying the science into strategies parents can use right away. She also gives parents clarity and confidence in what to do and how to do it. Dr. Tedesco is the co-author of the popular parenting book *Raising a Kid Who Can: Simple Strategies to Build a Lifetime of Adaptability and Emotional Strength*.
