The ceremonies will begin at 9:30 a.m. with a parade of the uniformed members of the Chicago Fire Department led by The Pipes and Drums of the CFD. The Mass will follow at 10:00 a.m.

At this service we will remember all the members of our CFD family who have died since last Memorial Day especially two members who made the ultimate sacrifice, dying in The Line of Duty. The Chicago Fire Department also lost and will remember eight active members and more than 125 retirees.

After the ceremony inside the church, we will gather around the flagpole at the corner of Roosevelt Road and May Street for the raising of the flag, a 21-gun salute and taps.


