Dear Members of the Saint Ignatius College Prep Community,

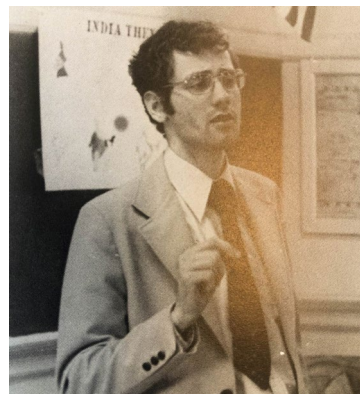

SUMMER AT 1076 W. ROOSEVELT HAS NEVER BEEN BUSIER

A ROBUST PROGRAM OF OFFERINGS

Every May, when another school year comes to an end, a peaceful quiet falls over the campus at Saint Ignatius College Prep. This calm does not last for long. Before you know it, summer camps and classes kick into high gear in early June. This summer we've seen 2,055 students and campers come through our doors. The school's summer programming has grown tremendously over the past two decades. We have expanded our offerings for current students, all the way down to prospective students in 5th through 8th grade who we call our Junior Wolfpack. It is an important outreach to the young people of Chicago. Whether they are interested in global affairs, volleyball, film or beyond, there is a place for every camper with the Wolfpack each summer.

Camps and classes are broken down into a few different categories. One area of programming involves academic classes for current Saint Ignatius students who are on campus for the month of June. Another involves academic classes for junior high students. The rest of the programming consists of two, 3-week sessions—one in June and the other in July. There are also shorter 4-day athletic camps, running Monday to Thursday during the summer.

Saint Ignatius offers a number of academic opportunities, college application supports and leadership development workshops for our current Saint Ignatius students looking to advance their skills and prepare for the future. Students can choose from Algebra II and AP Biology as well as an ACT Preparation class and a College Application workshop. One of the newer offerings is Personal Finance Boot Camp. This class is intended to provide students entering their junior

or senior year with an understanding of key economic transactions. The course is hands-on and provides students with the fundamentals of budgeting, the use of credit, legal issues related to landlord-tenant relationships and succeeding in the workplace (including an understanding of taxes, benefits and workplace culture). The goal of the course is to provide students with tools for managing the next steps in their personal, academic and professional lives.

CLASS CREDIT DURING THE SUMMER

We have a brand new senior elective credit summer course called Theology: On Holy Ground. This course and travel experience fulfills the senior Theology elective requirement and is a graded course that is included in the student's transcript and calculated into their GPA. This course also counts as the student's senior retreat requirement. On Holy Ground seeks to connect the traditional Catholic spiritual practices of prayer and contemplation with experiences of the beauty of God's creation. Students are prompted to consider the beauty of the natural world as reflections of God's own beauty and goodness. The course also emphasizes the experience of wonder and awe as an experiential gateway to Catholic spirituality and theology. The course culminates in a formative camping and hiking trip. This summer's inaugural trip took students to experience the beauty of California's natural wonders in the Redwoods, Yosemite National Park and Monterey Bay's ocean life.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

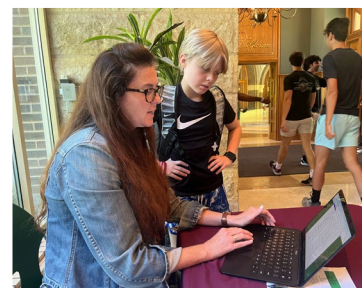
Academic Programs and Support. In that role, it is her responsibility to oversee the school's summer programs. She began the job as a co-director with Saint Ignatius counselor, Sean O'Connor, in the summer of 2020. She then took over the summer programs for the 2022 sessions and she's been at the helm ever since.

Loneragan '04 said, "I think one of the best things about our programs is how comprehensive they are. Lots of schools run summer camps but not many have the variety of sports, academic and extracurricular offerings we provide. When you also include our summer internship opportunities, there's really something for everyone. It's great to know that even before students enroll at Saint Ignatius, we offer opportunities for them to experience the intellectual excellence, openness to growth and loving community of the Wolfpack right in the heart of Chicago."

NEW CLASSES KEEP CAMP FUN

Another exciting new offering is Wolfpack Media camp for students going into 7th and 8th grade. This program is in its second year and includes three, single week-long camp sessions. It's moderated by Saint Ignatius science teacher, Chris Marks, who helped create the school's TV and podcast studios. This summer saw a full roster of 20 students signed up for each of the three weeks.

Week one was all about news broadcasting. Students were able to create an entire TV-style newscast while learning about video cameras, microphones, lighting and teleprompters. The second week looked at sports media and the creation of highlight reels. Campers experienced sports commentary in action and even got to work with the sports practices and athletic camps taking place on

Another big area of summer programs at Saint Ignatius is all the classes, camps and orientation days for incoming freshmen. Facilitated by school administration, faculty members and rising Saint Ignatius seniors, the “Wolfpack Welcome” is a 3-day orientation designed to help the newest members of the student body acclimate to life on campus. Students learn traditions, like the school fight song, meet new classmates and become acquainted with the WOLFPACK schedule, school buildings and their iPads. Incoming freshmen are also now allowed to take credit-earning classes like gym during the summer.

YEAR-LONG LEARNING

Our school community is blessed to have such a vibrant and active campus all year long. Besides our amazing current students who take part in summer offerings, we are also incredibly fortunate to have so many 5th through 8th graders spend time at Saint Ignatius during the summer months. It is a blessing to have the opportunity to introduce these potential future members of the Wolfpack to our Grad at Grad values. Through outstanding teaching and personal formation, our school challenges its talented students and campers to intellectual excellence, integrity and life-long learning and growth. Our dedication to educating young men and women for lives of faith, love, service and leadership does not happen only during the school year. It is a year-long pursuit that keeps the halls of 1076 West Roosevelt Road full of life and energy.

campus. The third week focused on filmmaking. Students made a commercial for a pretend perfume, a horror film, ads for commercial breaks during news broadcasts and even PSA anti-bullying segments; an idea they came up with on their own.

Marks said, “The goal is to expose students to many different types of media outside the regular social media world of Instagram, TikTok and others. We aim to focus on what students want to work on so the camp becomes sort of a choose-your-own-adventure as the week progresses.”

Other long-standing camps continue to thrive. Enrollment in sports camps is robust and this summer’s Model UN camp had the largest student group ever for a single camp. Camps for chess, Harlequins (theater) and robotics were all filled to capacity just a short time after the registration portals went live.

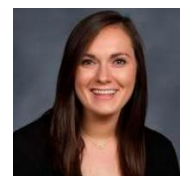

Dr. John Igwebuike Tapped For TEDx Talk

It all began with a request – one that made Dr. John G. Igwebuike chuckle.

He said, “Note the irony in the question, ‘Would you like to do a TEDx Talk on listening?’”

The Saint Ignatius College Prep Director of School Culture - Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and founder of Guanacaste: The Transformational Listening Conference, was “all in.” His presentation this spring followed much preparation that commenced when Dr. Juana Mendenhall, a professor of physical sciences at Morehouse College, invited him to speak. She heard Dr. John, as he is affectionately known on the Ignatius campus, give a talk at a “Soft Skills for STEM” workshop about the importance of soft skills and listening. Mendenhall, who holds a license at Morehouse to host TEDx Talks, invited Dr. John to join their conversation which featured multiple speakers. His gift to the discussion: the idea that active listening takes T-I-M-E. You have to **T**une in, **I**nteract to increase understanding, **M**ake a deeper human connection and **E**nhance the relationship.

This was Dr. John’s first TEDx Talk, and, like the art, skill, and practice of becoming a great listener – it was an educational journey. The objective of a TEDx Talk is to bring in an individual who is an expert in their field, and have them boil down their expertise, thought leadership and key ideas into a 12-to-18-minute speech.

“It was an interesting experience,” said Dr. John, “It was a presentation like none I’d ever given. I had a speaking coach, and I formed a wonderful rapport with Coach Carmen.”

The buildup to the talk included 10 Zoom coaching sessions to prepare and practice. Most speeches don’t typically come with camera coverage – this one did. It was a three-camera shoot with an audience of about 150 people.

Dr. John said, “I was nervous in the sense I’d never done a TEDx Talk.”



He represented each letter in his T-I-M-E initialism, with a personal vignette that illustrated how he became a better listener by taking the time to learn from communication misperceptions, missteps and mistakes.

It was his goal to convey that listening is one of the greatest skills rarely taught, but that with discipline, effort and practice over time, you can develop your listening capacity.

“My speech was about facilitating the process of becoming a better listener to ourselves, our loved ones and our fellow human beings,” said Dr. John, “It takes grace, compassion, and the precious gift of our time.”

Our Students, The Muralists!

For weeks, a group of Saint Ignatius College Prep students took a walk after school down Taylor Street to a garden in the city. Their goal was simple: to use their talent to leave something beautiful in the community we all call home.

Their project, which bloomed this spring, began with Fine Arts teacher Emily Steffen. She is a volunteer with Taylor Street Farms, an urban garden and collaborative community. Its mission includes growing produce for families who are food insecure -- good work for others, that was about to come back to them.

Turns out, the garden has a tool shed that needed a makeover. The Saint Ignatius Art Club made the small structure their canvas, drawing a garden-themed picture including bees because Taylor Street Farms is also a bee sanctuary. Leona Bergin '24, who started the Art Club on campus, was excited to found the group and be a part of the project.

"Starting the Art Club was really exciting. It showed me that I can genuinely make a difference within my school if I have an idea and others to help," said Bergin, "My club mates and I created a piece of art that we hope will bring joy to the Chicago community even after we have graduated. That has been a great honor!"

It seems like it was great fun, too. Brush stroke, by brush stroke, the mural came to life. We watched as students painted in the sketched picture on one sunny May day. Elsie Fernandez '26 said, "I honestly love the peace of painting, the feeling it brings and just being able to work on the mural with the whole entire club."

Fine Arts teacher Teegan Ness loved how the mural introduced something students can't get in a classroom.

"They're learning a new skill. Painting on a giant wall is a difficult thing. Following a pattern we've traced makes it hard to put the puzzle pieces together sometimes. They are learning how to do something we couldn't achieve in the classroom setting, where we couldn't work at this large of a scale," said Ness.

MEET SAINT IGNATIUS

Meet Saint Ignatius College Prep, a coed Jesuit Catholic school in the heart of Chicago that strives to provide a diverse student body with a high-quality—and financially accessible—education. The goal of school administration, faculty, and staff members is to produce well-rounded, service-oriented leaders of tomorrow. And they are on a mission to make their education affordable to anyone who qualifies. In the 2022-2023 school year, Saint Ignatius provided more than \$6 million dollars in tuition assistance to students who would not otherwise be able to afford tuition. In doing so, Saint Ignatius College Prep continues to build on a more than 150-year tradition of changing lives.

As Saint Ignatius embarked on planning for the next 150 years, the Endowment Committee, with strong support from the Board and executive staff, decided they had a real opportunity—and an obligation—to elevate their performance and impact by investing with top-tier diverse managers. Their thesis was that expanding opportunities for up-and-coming managers could unlock outperformance through increased competition and the agility often exhibited by smaller firms pioneering innovative investment strategies. Performance has always been the endowment's foremost objective, enabling the school to maximize the financial aid available to students, keep tuition costs low, and attract and retain high-quality teachers. However, the Endowment



Committee believed broadening emerging manager participation would augment long-term returns.

The Endowment Committee's experience led them to conclude that there were managers who were being overlooked but possessed the grit and determination to outperform. They often witnessed the same unmatched work ethic and drive to succeed among many of their own students, a third of whom came from diverse backgrounds. Their approach aligned both with the mission of the school and with its philosophy of preparing students for lives of faith, love, service, and leadership.

The Endowment Committee worked to create a policy specific to Emerging Managers to add to the Investment Policy Statement. This important step provided guidelines for how to increase opportunities for top-performing diverse managers by making their process more equitable, while still maintaining the same rigorous performance standards. The policy focused on allocating capital to firms that are at least 51% owned by women or people of color (POC). Once complete, Saint Ignatius became the first Catholic institution in the country to implement an Emerging Manager Policy for their endowment.

In 2022, Saint Ignatius partnered closely with Cambridge Associates (CA), their lead advisor since 2021, to increase their

exposure to top rated diverse managers, particularly in private investments. They leaned on CA's diverse manager research capabilities and together, the Endowment Committee and their CA investment team worked together to re-assess most of the portfolio across each asset class. This process included changing the asset allocation policy to accommodate a greater allocation to private investments with an emphasis on performance and inclusivity.

In March 2023, one year into making significant changes to their manager lineup, CA led what is now the annual emerging manager diversity review process for Saint Ignatius. They reported that 31% of the Long-Term Investment Portfolio (LTIP) was allocated to emerging managers (defined as 51% or more ownership by women and/or POC). An additional 11% was allocated to majority diverse-led firms and strategies (defined as 50% or more leadership by women or POC), and 29% was allocated to significantly diverse firms and strategies (defined as 33% or more ownership or leadership by women or POC)—and as a result, a total of 71% of the LTIP was allocated to diverse managers. And most importantly, the portfolio generated competitive returns that outperformed their benchmark, allowing Saint Ignatius to expand educational access to students who might not otherwise be able to afford it.

LESSONS LEARNED

Here are five things Saint Ignatius has learned from implementing an emerging manager policy:

GAIN SUPPORT

The Endowment Committee knew it was imperative to earn support from all corners of the organization before implementing a diverse manager strategy—this included the President, executive staff, and the Board. The Endowment Committee built a strong case, with performance as the cornerstone, to highlight the benefits of investing with diverse managers, both from a mission-alignment perspective and as a way to generate outperformance. Once the

Board, Committee, and Staff were aligned, they could move forward in developing a strategy.

AGREE ON STRATEGY

The Endowment Committee and Board decided they needed to create a dedicated Emerging Manager Policy to add to the Investment Policy Statement. This became the road map that guided their investment decisions and outlined exactly how they should engage with diverse managers. The Endowment Committee and Board also agreed to define an emerging manager as 51% ownership by women or people of color—higher than the 33% threshold used by many. These specific guidelines helped to ensure that they were allocating their capital in a way that reflected their goals.

DON'T JUST "CHECK THE BOX"

In partnership with CA, Saint Ignatius made the decision to measure diversity across additional dimensions, beyond firm ownership, to promote greater diversity throughout the entire investment management industry. When they evaluate managers, they now assess the diversity of firm and strategy leadership to incentivize large firms to attract, promote, and retain diverse investment talent. In addition to majority diverse firms, they also measure significant diversity (33%+ diverse firms/strategies), which allows diverse founders to monetize wealth, transition ownership to the next generation, and/or support firm growth by seeking outside investors.

EVALUATE AND ADJUST

Saint Ignatius, in partnership with CA, measures and regularly assesses whether

they are meeting the objectives of their Emerging Manager Policy, which includes a comprehensive annual review of their progress. While early results support their thesis that investing with diverse managers can lead to outperformance, they have set ambitious growth targets and the Endowment Committee remains highly engaged in the oversight of the portfolio, ensuring its success when measured against benchmarks.

THINK BIG

This is just the beginning for Saint Ignatius. They are not only focused on aligning their portfolio with their mission, but they have developed a long-term strategic plan to create enough tuition support so every student in Greater Chicago, regardless of economic background, can access the high-quality, Jesuit values-based education they provide. They are committed to boldly pursuing all opportunities to elevate their mission for future generations. And they hope that being the first Catholic institution in the country to successfully implement an Emerging Manager Policy will inspire other similar organizations to follow suit. It's a lofty goal, but one they're working towards from multiple angles.

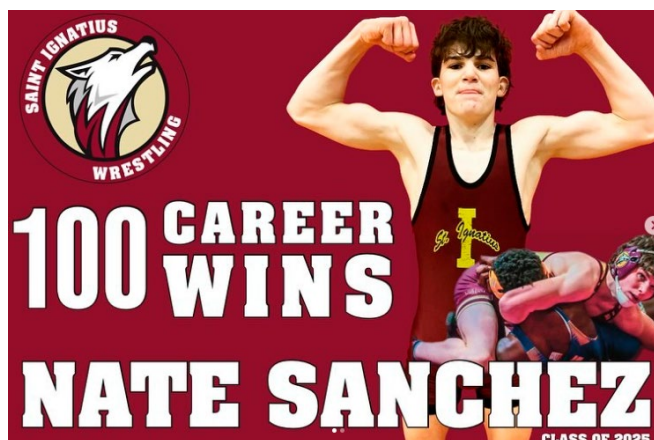

Flipping and twisting, Gunderson left his best on the floor, then hit the road again with his folks, traveling another 100 plus miles back to the Chicago area to bring more of his best to an altogether different competition. That's right, Gunderson was set to represent the Wolfpack at the Metro Catholic Aquatic Conference competition in diving.

And here's the really impressive outcome: After literally going the distance to be at both events, and being part of the 23rd place finish at State with the cheer team, Gunderson won the diving contest.



Saint Ignatius College Prep Athletic Director Mike Hurley '07 called it a "really special story that highlights an extraordinary work ethic, dedication and commitment" to compete at a high level across multiple sports.

"Competing at the IHSA State Finals on Friday afternoon with his teammates in Bloomington, then returning to join his swimming and diving team...and winning the diving championship, is just an incredible feat that we have not seen," said Hurley.

Juggling the demands of two sports, in addition to the rigorous academics at Saint Ignatius, prepared the freshman for that challenging day - one he didn't imagine was possible when he was working to get on the teams.

"I wasn't expecting to make it on the varsity team for cheer because I'd never done it. It was a shock that I got on varsity...and with diving, I wasn't expecting to win as many competitions as I did," said Gunderson.

Coaches in both sports chalk up his success to his dedication.

"He takes his role very seriously, and comes to practice looking to improve everyday," said 2023-2024 Head Diving Coach Mike Sprehe, "Connor is one of the most naturally talented kids I've had a chance to coach. He's a very strong competitor."

Proof is in what he's accomplished. He's heading to State in diving as a freshman.

"His grit, tenacity and determination have truly shown through this season leading to a successful outcome for both sports," said Dilay, "What is extremely impressive, is that he is the only student-athlete at Saint Ignatius College Prep to do two sports within one season and qualify for State for both as a freshman. All of his hard work has paid off, and we are immensely proud of Connor."

Gunderson says the dual-sport, same-season experience has taught him a lot. He shared a couple of the big lessons.

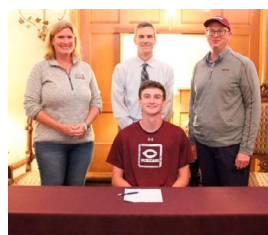

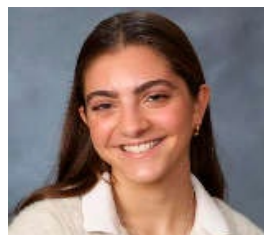

Superior General Visits Midwest

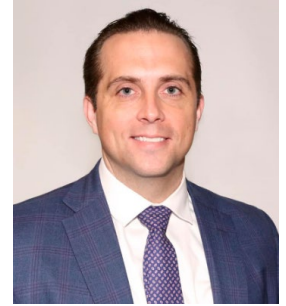
Arturo Sosa, S.J. is a Venezuelan Catholic priest who serves as the 31st and present Superior General of the Society of Jesus. He was elected by the Society's 36th General Congregation on 14 October 2016, succeeding Adolfo Nicolás. He is the first person born in Latin America to lead the Jesuits.

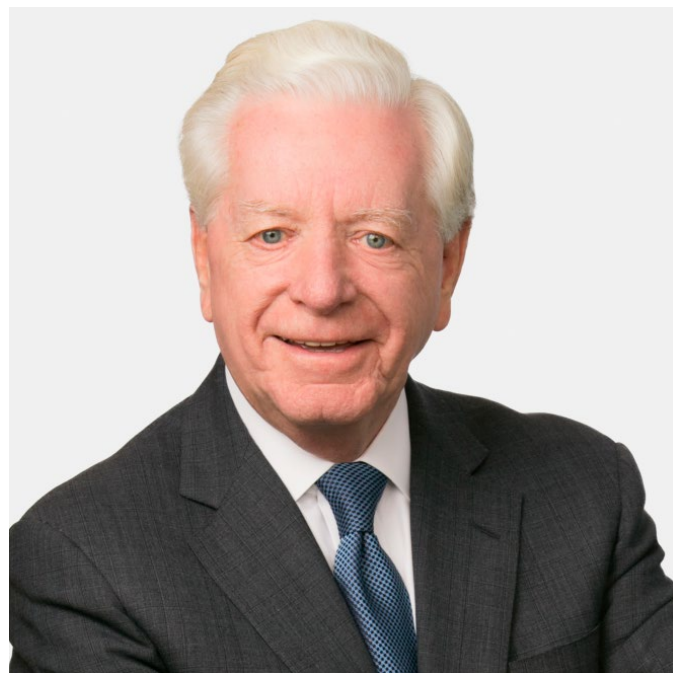

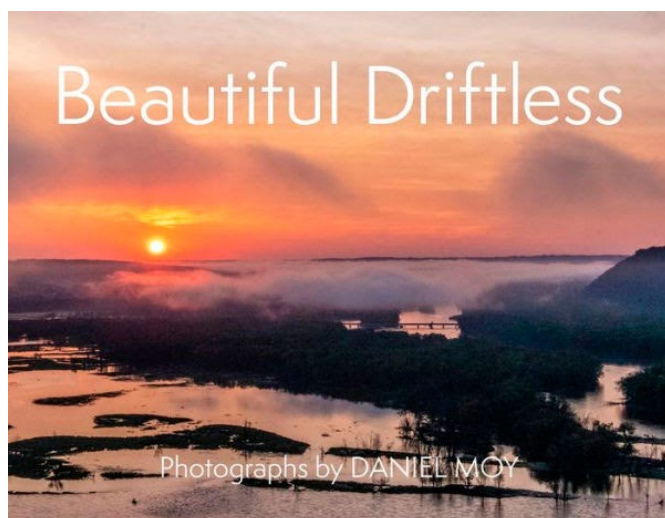
THREE ALUMNI COMPLETE RANGER SCHOOL

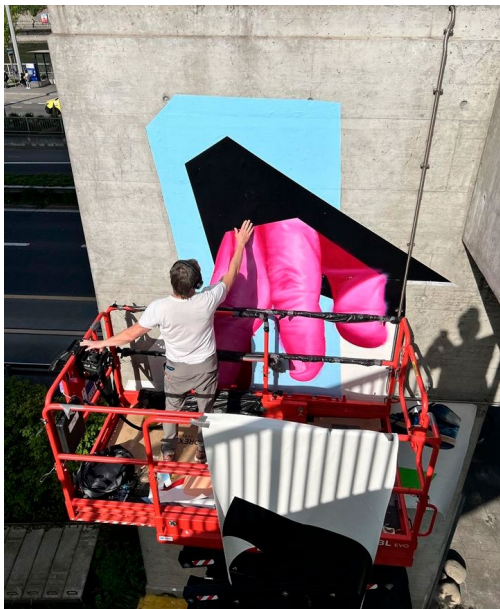
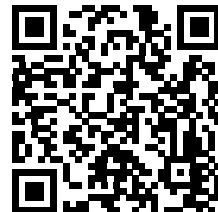

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Our Neighbors Over the Years

The old adage that “a picture is worth 1,000 words” has taken on new meaning since I found a rare photograph in a scrapbook in the Brunswick Room. Taken in 1896 by members of the St. Ignatius College Camera Club and saved by an anonymous Jesuit, it depicts priests on the balcony of the college building looking down on a large crowd of men, women and children. As I discovered through research, the student photographers were recording a powerful moment in time: the end of the Confirmation Day parade on May 31. This annual event drew thousands of spectators to the Gothic Church of the Holy Family and the daily papers were fulsome in their praise, recounting in detail the sight of children and bands and parish societies who marched in procession through the Near West Side.

Little could members of the Camera Club envision how significant their 1896 snapshot would become—they also had captured the future site of Saint Ignatius College Prep’s athletic building at 1055 W. Roosevelt Road! When photo-artist Paul Lane examined the faded image he said, “There’s a lot here I can work with.” Talk about an understatement. His enlargement revealed a stunning portrait of life in the densely populated urban neighborhood Rev. Arnold Damen, S.J. had helped to create from 1857 until his death in 1890.

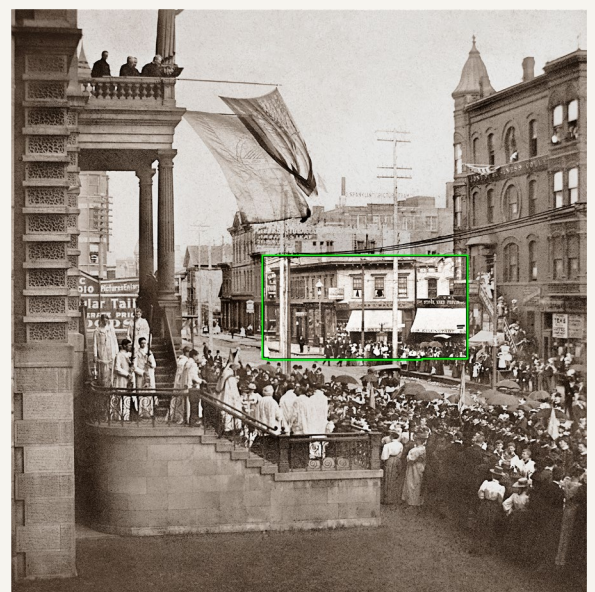
Anchoring the intersection of Blue Island Avenue and Twelfth Street (now Roosevelt Road) were John I. Maloney’s saloon and the Eisenstadt Brothers’ Meat Market. The son of Irish immigrants, Maloney fell in love with Mary Yore, baptized by Fr. Damen in 1862. The couple married

in Holy Family Church in 1888 and lived nearby at 1139 W. Taylor Street. It’s impossible to know how the Maloneys felt about the temperance efforts of Rev. James M. Hayes, S.J., founder of the American League of the Cross. But their family business may have suffered because members of the League pledged to “refrain from entering, without strict necessity, places where [liquor is] sold.”

The Eisenstadt Brothers—Gustave, Herman, and Louis—were butchers and owners of a popular market that provided Irish, Jewish and Italian families with special cuts of meat from the Union Stock Yards. Born in Germany, they emigrated to the United States before 1890 and quickly became citizens. After Herman Eisenstadt married Regina Westerfield, the couple lived above the store on Blue Island Avenue, where

they welcomed their daughter, Eda, in 1887. Regina Eisenstadt challenged domestic stereotypes of her day by continuing the meat market business with her brothers-in-law after Herman died in 1894.

In an ambitious engineering effort, in 1916, Twelfth Street was widened to 108 feet between Ashland Avenue and Canal Street. While Church of the Holy Family and St. Ignatius College remained intact, every structure on the south side of the street was moved 42 feet. Thanks to a rare photo in a SICP scrapbook, we know that the busy intersection then featured a United Cigar Store with offices above for Max Goodman's real estate business and the photography studio of David Kaminsky. Rev. John Furay, S.J., college president, informed alums that the "vast improvement" along the newly renamed Roosevelt Road had resulted in increased enrollment, a "second-spring" for the school.

The frame structure at the corner of Blue Island and Roosevelt (later known as "Dutch's"), looms large in the memories of many Saint Ignatius alums of a certain

age—and for good reason. It was here that students from all parts of the city gathered after their early morning commute to drink coffee and eat donuts or have a quick cigarette before classes began. Members of the class of 1965 had a front-row seat to history, watching the new modern campus of the University of Illinois take shape between Morgan and Halsted streets.

Eighty years after members of the Camera Club documented life across the street from Saint Ignatius College Prep, another transformation was underway. On March 12, 1976 Mayor Richard J. Daley and architect Stanley Tigerman wielded shovels at the groundbreaking for the Illinois Regional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped at 1055 W. Roosevelt Road. Thanks to Special Collections archivists at Harold Washington Library who digitized negatives from Department of Urban Renewal Records I discovered rare close-up shots of the event. More surprises awaited: the Mayor and dignitaries wore Walsh Construction hardhats. Matt '64 and Dan '65 Walsh were in the crowd

at Blue Island Avenue and Roosevelt Road, never imagining that this project would one day become part of their alma mater's campus.

Although Mayor Daley did not live to see the Library for the Blind dedicated in 1978, its construction reflected his role as a city-builder. Like the "Picasso" statue downtown, the unusual design of the library and its bold colors took Chicagoans by surprise. However, local residents who lived in public housing high rises south of Roosevelt Road especially appreciated its branch of the Chicago Public Library.

In 2023, Saint Ignatius College Prep acquired the former library site occupied for many years by the Lakeside Bank. Adjoining the school's practice field, the V-shape building marks a new chapter in the school's history. It is my hope that the visual timeline of historic photos that now greets SICP students in the athletic building at 1055 W. Roosevelt Road will remind us all that Arnold Damen's belief in urban life remains alive and well in the Twenty-first Century.
